Benchmark K-8 Assessment Results for 2022-23: State statute section 98B requires reporting for grades K-8 and to provide a report to the Board of Education and North Ed website. Food Service Provider Update for Center-Based Programs: We will have a change in service provider for school meals for special education. The estimated cost is not available at this time. We are waiting for the final state aid budget to be released to determine the amount of revenue available for school meal reimbursements next year.
