Trauma-Informed Practices and Discipline – Lisa Klepper, Supervisor, and Carey Curran, Teacher, Creekside School:

Carey provided an overview of this instructional practice that has improved student outcomes for students at Creekside. This practice is in support of students to provide compassionate instruction and discipline to help build supportive relationships, where students are given choices and share decision making power, which will then influence behavior. Research shows that more than two-thirds of children reported at least one traumatic event before the age of sixteen and those with trauma learn best when they feel safe and supported. Through trauma-informed practices, strategies are developed that address the neurological and attachment needs of students impacted by adversity by educator self-awareness, mindset shift and collaboration across systems in the community. This practice has aligned with positive behavior interventions and support to clearly define school-wide expectations, displayed and explicitly taught with consistent language and then positively reinforced. Another support for students includes using mindfulness each day as we coach and model for well-being and balance. We continue to recognize that behaviors can be a response to traumatic events and is a form of communication, and that students need structure and compassionate responses to feel safe and supported.

Motion by Board Member McKellar, supported by Board Member Carpenter to approve continuation of a 100% Summer Tax Collection in those districts that implement at 100% summer collection:

WHEREAS, this Board previously adopted a resolution to impose a summer tax levy to collect 100% of annual school property taxes, including debt service, upon property located within the District and continuing from year-to-year until specifically revoked by the Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. Pursuant to the Revised School Code, MCL 380.1 et seq., the Board invokes for 2023 its previously-adopted ongoing resolution imposing a summer tax levy of 100% of annual school property taxes,

including debt service, upon property located within the District and continuing from year-to-year until specifically revoked by the Board and requests that each city and/or township in which the District is located collect those summer taxes.

- 2. The Superintendent or designee is authorized and directed to forward to the governing body of each city and/or township in which the District is located a copy of this Board's resolution imposing a summer property tax levy on an ongoing basis and a copy of this resolution requesting that each such city and/or township agree to collect the summer tax levy for 2023 in the amount specified in this resolution. Such forwarding of the resolutions and the request to collect the summer tax levy shall be performed so that they are received by the governing bodies on or before December 31, 2022.
- 3. Pursuant to and in accordance with Revised School Code Section 1613(1), the Superintendent or designee is authorized and directed to negotiate on behalf of the District with the governing body of each city and/or township in which the District is located for the reasonable expenses for collection of the District's summer tax levy that the city and/or township may bill under Revised School Code Sections 1611 or 1612. Any such proposed agreement shall be brought before this Board for its approval or disapproval.
- 4. All resolutions and parts of resolutions insofar as they conflict with the provisions of this resolution be and the same are rescinded.

Updates:

Superintendent's Report - Dr. Nick Ceglarek:

1. Today was Regional Staff Development Day and he recognized the work from Matt Olson and the entire instructional team, Jennifer Jesse, Nicole Sheehan, Brandi Reynolds and our technology department. We hosted over 1,000 regional educators at Traverse City West Senior High School and West Middle School including national, state and local presenters. He thanked TCAPS for hosting the sites and Chartwell for catering.

- 2. Wished good luck to candidates in the region seeking board seats in their district including Board Member Brown as well as to all the local district ballot proposals and Headlee overrides next Tuesday.
- 3. He shared a memorandum of understanding for the Talent Together consortium of 11 ISD's regarding an initiative of a talent pipeline for teachers. There is a crisis in the decrease of individuals going into the teaching profession. The teacher shortage in Michigan and nationally continues to worsen with Michigan experiencing a 66% decline in the number of available new teachers over the past decade. This cost sharing agreement is a collaborative effort to provide additional solutions to alleviate the teacher shortage problem and an attempt to work with MDE to increase that pipeline. We hope that the MDE will approve an alternative certification program.
