



Career-Tech Center Parents Survey Summary Report

May 3, 2019



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Introduction

The Traverse Bay Area Intermediate School District conducted an online survey of its Career-Tech Center parents to help guide its strategic planning. Other surveys are being conducted with Career Tech Center students, Special Education students and parents, as well as with local district superintendents and principals, and TBAISD staff.

A total **125** responses were received April 12 - 29, 2019.

Parents responding to this survey have children who attend all 23 programs available at the Career-Tech Center, with the most attending the Allied Health (17%), Information Technology (13%), and Public Safety/Protective Services (10%) programs. Several parents cited more than one program at the Career-Tech Center.

Eighteen different local public school districts are represented in this sample, with the most from the Traverse City (35%) district.

Almost all of the parents responding have CTC students who are 11th-graders (56%) or 12th-graders (49%), with two 10th-graders. Several parents have children in both 11th- and 12th-grade, explaining why these total more than 100%.

One-fourth of the parents have older children who also previously attended the Career-Tech Center (26%).

Career-Tech Center responsive to parents questions and messages

Three-fourths of the parents (75%) responding to this survey feel their children's **Career-Tech Center teachers are responsive to their questions and messages**, including 50% who reply "very responsive."

Very few (just 3%) say the teachers are unresponsive, while 22% reply "neutral."

Forty percent of the parents responding to this survey feel the **Career-Tech Center guidance** counselors are responsive to their questions and messages, including 23% who reply "very responsive."

A scant 1% say the guidance counselors are unresponsive, while 59% reply "neutral."

More than half of the parents (53%) responding to this survey feel the **Career-Tech Center** administrators are responsive to their questions and messages, including 28% who reply "very responsive."

Very few (just 2%) say the administrators are unresponsive, while 46% reply "neutral."

Six-sevenths of the parents (86%) responding to this survey are **satisfied with the availability of technology in their child's program at the Career-Tech Center**, including 46% who are "very satisfied."

Zero percent are dissatisfied, while 14% are "neutral."

Five-sixths of the parents (83%) responding to this survey are **satisfied**" with how technology is used in their child's classrooms at the Career-Tech Center, including 40% who are "very satisfied."

Expectations that education and experiences at Career-Tech Center are preparing their child for what happens after they graduate

Most of the parents (94%) responding to this survey believe their **education and experiences** at the Career-Tech Center are preparing their children for education after high school (such as college or technical school), including 64% who reply "definitely yes."

Just 2% reply "no," while 5% are "not sure."

Most of the parents (93%) responding to this survey believe their **education and experiences** at the Career-Tech Center are preparing their children for work, employment and career, including 57% who reply "definitely yes."

Only 2% reply "no," while 6% are "not sure."

Many of the parents (88%) responding to this survey believe their **education and experiences at the Career-Tech Center are preparing their children for everyday life**, including 50% who reply "definitely yes."

A scant 1% reply "no," while 11% are "not sure."

Career-Tech Center students are still able to participate in extracurricular activities at their local high school

Most of the parents (91%) responding to this survey believe that **their Career-Tech Center student is still able to participate in extra-curricular activities at their local high school**. This includes a noteworthy 72% who reply "definitely yes."

Very few (just 2%) do not feel their child at the Career-Tech Center can participate in extracurriculars, while 8% are "neutral."

Fifty-nine percent of the parents responding to this survey are **satisfied with how student discipline is consistently enforced at the Career-Tech Center**. This includes 28% who are "very satisfied."

Very few (just 2%) are dissatisfied with how student discipline is consistently enforced, while 39% are "neutral."

At least one staff member at the Career-Tech Center knows their child well enough to recognize if something was different or troubling them

Eighty percent of the parents responding to this survey believe that **at least one teacher**, **paraprofessional**, **administrator**, **or other staff member at the Career-Tech** Center knows their child well enough to recognize if something was different or troubling with their child. This includes 51% who reply "definitely yes."

Very few (only 4%) do not feel that a Career-Tech Center staff member knows their child to that degree, while 16% are "neutral."

Suggestions to improve the Career-Tech Center

Here are the parents unaided verbatim responses when asked for their suggestions or recommendations to improve the TBAISD Career-Tech Center:

Most frequently cited suggested improvements:

- Communications and information about the CTC programs, especially at the local district
- Improve second year curriculum
- Four of the 10 comments actually praise the CTC, including two who praise specific teachers

At times X in the Y program has seemed difficult when relating to students and responding to their concerns. There have been discussions at home about her attitude towards her students. Mr. Preventure came to the NTHS induction even though James was the only student of his program being inducted. Mr. Preventure has been so supportive of James and has really been instrumental in building James confidence.

Same problem as when I attended CTC when I was in high school. There is NO difference in the class curriculum between first year and second year. Granted, her first year was awesome. However, second year students become very bored. Also, my daughters class was full of students that did not what to be there. They were seeking an easy "A" and an escape from their home school. This brought the whole class down and may have affected my daughters career path. My son wants to attend CTC, that will definitely not happen. Eric V.
