Below: To be under something.

The bookshelf is below the window.

Prompt:

What lives below the ocean?

What is below head?

What is below _____(object in room)?

Forward: To move ahead or to go forward.

The teacher asked us to move forward one step.

Prompt:

Have the students move forward a few inches.

Have students face forward, then look to the side, then forward again.

Have students bend forward, lean forward.

Between: In the middle of two things.

The boy stood between the two girls.

Prompt:

What letter is between “a” and “c”?

What number is between 7 and 9?

Who is sitting between ___ and ___?

What is between your head and your feet?

Skip: To leave out something or pass over something. It also means to move with a hop.

When we were reading the book, I did not want to skip any pages.

I learned to skip yesterday.

Prompt:

On alphabet strip, point to the letters A, B, D, E and verbalize while pointing. Ask “Did I skip a letter? Which letter? (linear skipping) Have students try same activity.

Form a small group, give all the girls an object and skip the boys (skipping by category).
